English

Our English lessons will be linked to our Geography unit: rainforests. We will be writing a rainforest setting description and a persuasive advert about saving the rainforest.

Grammar is taught in context during each writing lesson but we will also be focusing on singular to plural nouns, pronouns, using Standard English, compound words and adverbials of time and cause.

<u>Topic</u>

We are investigating the enquiry question 'Why are rainforests important to us?'. We will be looking at different biomes; locating the Amazon rainforest, naming its features and investigating its importance; exploring the four layers of the rainforest and the different ways plants and trees have adapted to life there. Towards the end of the unit, we will be doing a comparative local area study, investigating how our woodland has been used, collecting and presenting data in a variety of different ways.

PSHE

Our theme is 'Dreams and Goals'.

ICT

Our unit of work will focus on the Internet as a network and how it needs to be kept secure.

Music

We will be exploring musical rounds and ostinatos.

Maths

We are following the White Rose
Mastery Maths structure. This half
term, we will be focusing on mental
and written methods for
multiplication, calculating the length
and perimeter of polygons and will
be making a start into our unit on
fractions.

<u>Art</u>

Our craft and design art unit will also be inspired by rainforests. We will be using rainforest themed images and exploring how we can create our own nature-themed patterns, culminating in a batik. Alongside this, we will study the work of William Marris.

Science

Our unit for this half term is 'Living Things and their Habitats'. We will be exploring the seven life processes, sorting and grouping animals and exploring vertebrate and invertebrate animals. We will carry out an investigation into living things that are found in our local area and explore how classification keys are used to sort and group things. Our topic will culminate by looking at how animals are adapted to their environments and explore how human behaviour can change animals' habitats, making links with our Geography knowledge and the Amazon rainforest.
